Being the first meeting of the Academic Council of the college, all the members introduced themselves. The items on the agenda and those permitted by the chair were taken up for consideration.

1. Business brought forwarded by the Principal

01. Election (Selection) of the Secretary to the Academic Council

As the first item of the academic council, Dr Sr Soosamma Kavumpurath, chairperson, stated the need of a Secretary to the academic council. Dr Stanley John, suggested the name of Dr. P. J. Jojo and Dr A. R. Titus seconded. The council unanimously elected Dr. P. J. Jojo as the Secretary to the Academic Council.

Resolved that the election be approved.

02. B.A., B.Sc. B.Com., M.A., M.Sc. and M.Com. Degree Syllabus for the academic year 2014-15 under the autonomous steam – approved – reporting of – reg.

The Academic Council considered the syllabi recommended by the respective Board of studies for the First Degree and P. G. Courses started in the academic year 2014-15 under the autonomous stream.

Resolved that the action taken by the Principal be approved.

03. Examination Manual reporting of -reg

The Chairperson, Dr Sr Soosamma Kavumpurath presented the new examination manual to the council and sought modifications, if any, from the council members (Copy distributed)

04. Introduction of new self financing courses - discussions - reg

The Academic Council discussed the possibilities of beginning new Academic Programs in the college. Different Departments suggested various courses at Certificate, Diploma, First degree, Post graduate and Research levels. Following were the proposed courses:

- 1. Additional batches (self financing) for First Degree Programs in English and Commerce in view of high demand for admissions in the subjects
- 2. To continue the Food & Diary Technology PG course in self financing stream as and when the support from UGC for the said regular course is ended.
- 3. A three level (Certificate, Diploma and Advanced Diploma) course in Communication English.
- 4. M Phil Degree in Physics, Chemistry, Commerce and Malayalam.
- 5. Certificate Courses like business mathematics

Resolved to invite proposals from the Departments and to constitute a three member committee comprising of Dr Stephen Nigli Joseph, Dr A. R. Titus and Dr P.J. Jojo to scrutinize and study the feasibility of the courses. Tentative date of scrutiny is November 24, 2014.

05. Syllabus for the next academic year- approval -reg

Revision of the syllabus for the next academic year has to be taken up by the Board of Studies of each department. The marks for Continuous Assessment (CA) and End Semester Examination (ESE) are to be as follows:

1. Business brought forwarded by the Principal

01. Passing minutes of the previous meeting held on 29 October 2014

As the first item of the agenda, the Secretary of the Academic Council Dr. P. J. Jojo presented the minutes of the meeting held on 29 October 2014 and was passed by the council.

Resolved that the minutes of the previous meeting be approved.

02. Syllabus and scheme of the graduate programs - reg.

The Academic Council considered the syllabi recommended by the respective Board of studies for the First Degree Courses to be started in the academic year 2015-16 under the autonomous stream.

Resolved that the syllabi approved by the respective board of studies be approved.

03. Scheme & pattern of question paper -reg

The Controller of Examinations, Dr K S Dersamambika proposed a new pattern of question paper for graduate courses to make the total marks 75. The suggestion was as follows:

04. Minimum Pass requirement for UG courses - discussions - reg

The Academic Council discussed the minimum pass requirements for UG course with effect from the academic year 2015-16.

Resolved to adopt a minimum of 40% marks (E Grade) for passing a course with a separate minimum of 40% (ie. 10 out of 25) for Continuous Assessment (CA) and 40% (ie. 30 out of 75) for End Semester Examination (ESE).

05. Syllabus for the next academic year- approval -reg

Revision of the syllabus for the next academic year has to be taken up by the Board of Studies of each department. The marks for Continuous Assessment (CA) and End Semester Examination (ESE) are to be as follows:

06. Minimum credits for UG Courses -approval -reg

The Academic Council discussed the accumulated minimum credits required for the successful completion of a various Graduate Programmes and the breakup of the required 120 credits is fixed as follows with a condition that no course will carry more than 4 credits:

07. Internal and mid-semester Examinations - discussion -reg

The Academic Council discussed the mode for awarding internal marks on the basis of the mid-semester and internal examinations. The council proposed to conduct 2 examinations during each semester for each graduate course. One examination should be conducted at department level with maximum marks 30 and another centralized mid-semester examination with maximum marks 75 in the end semester examination model. Both marks should be reduced to 15 the average will be taken as the internal mark.

Resolved the proposal

08. Syllabus and scheme of Post-graduate programs - reg.

The Academic Council considered the syllabi recommended by the respective Board of studies for the Post-graduate Programmes to be started in the academic year 2015-16 under the autonomous stream.

Resolved that the syllabi proposed by the respective board of studies be approved.

09. Scheme & pattern of question paper -reg

The Academic Council discussed the scheme and pattern of the Question Paper for the Post graduate courses. It was pointed out that division of syllabus into units are different for each Programme, a unified scheme and pattern for question papers is not feasible. Therefore, the Scheme and question paper may be set for 70 marks as per the syllabi.

The council unanimously agreed to the suggestion of the Department of Malayalam to set one of their question papers in the NET Examination Model.

Resolved the proposal

10. New self financing Programmes – approval –reg

The Programme Syllabi for the B A English Language, Literature and Communication, B Sc. Computer Science and B Com Cooperation passed by the respective Board of Studies be approved. The scheme and pattern of the question paper be same as the similar Programmes in the departments concerned.

11. Valuation of answer scripts - reg

The Academic Council discussed the operation of Centralised Valuation Camp for an infallible evaluation of answer scripts. After a detailed discussion it was proposed that the valuation should be done during the semester break of each Semester. Valuation of each paper (course) should be done by the additional examiners in presence of Chief Examiner.

Resolved that the proposal be approved.
