The Food Court at Fatima College is one of the best food courts in college campuses in Kerala as “good and tasty food is served in clean surroundings”. With a seating capacity of 100 at any given time, the food court is adequately staffed to serve all the customers that include the students, faculty, parents, guests, alumni and others who avail the services. The serving area is common to all. The Food court functions from 9 am to 5 pm, and is frequented by almost all the members in the campus. Clean and hygiene food that includes rice and its assorted curries; both vegetarian and non-vegetarian, other Kerala dishes are served. The Food court also serves snacks, beverages, juice and assorted ice-creams at a nominal rate which the students can afford. The management ensures that no junk food is sold in the Food court. The presence of a canteen is a blessing to the college as it helps in the successive implementation of the midday meal scheme of the “Fatima Share and Care programme’. In addition to this, the snacks and beverages required for all the programmes conducted at the college are served by the Canteen, helping us save food miles. Located in between the PG block and the main building, the Food Court is easily accessible to all. The Food court acts as an information centre as the TV displayed there, shows pieces of news related to job opportunities and opportunities for higher studies. The Canteen follows Green protocol, and a biogas plant in the canteen premise provides alternate energy source.
