#### MINUTES OF THE GOVERNING COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON JANUARY 28, 2016 AT THE IQAC HALL FATIMA MATA NATIONAL COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS), KOLLAM

The third meeting of the Governing Council was held at the IQAC Hall, Fatima Mata National College, Kollam on 28-01-2016. Rt Rev. Dr Stanley Roman, the Bishop of Quilon graced the occasion. Rev. Fr. Anil Jose, Manager of the College, presided over the meeting. The following members were present:

The Meeting commenced with a silent prayer.

#### Opening remarks of the Manager

The Manager formally welcomed the members to the meeting of the Governing Council and briefed the members on the items of the agenda to be transacted.

### Minutes of the previous meeting

The Principal, being the ex-officio Secretary, presented the minutes of the previous meeting of the Governing Council held on 10/04/2015. The report was confirmed through circulation and later ratified. Dr N. Veeramanikandan, the Pro Vice Chancellor of the University of Kerala, suggested that the copies of the minutes circulated among the members at the meeting be treated as formal presentation so that it need not be read out word to word. The council collectively agreed to the suggestion and decided to follow the proposed procedure from the next meeting.

## Action taken report

The Principal reported on the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting, as per the agenda circulated. The Governing Council ratified the action taken on the minutes.

## **Ratification of Results**

The Governing Council ratified the following results approved by the awards

- a. First Semester UG 2015-2016 (Regular and Self-Financing)
- b. Third Semester UG 2015-2016 (Regular)
- c. First Semester PG 2015-2016 (Regular)
- d. Third Semester PG 2015-2016 (Regular)

## ii. Approval of the proposal of the Finance Committee

The Governing Council approved the budget proposal of the Finance Committee pertaining to the Autonomous Fund created through examination and other relevant fees.

## Approval of the syllabus for the UG programmes under the self-financing stream commencing in 2016-17

The Governing Council resolved to approve the syllabus for the UG Programme of Bachelor of Commerce with Computer Application in Self Financing stream, adopting the scheme and Syllabus of the University of Kerala.

#### Approval of Syllabus of the 'Environmental Studies' Course

The Governing Council resolved to approve the proposal of the Academic Council for introducing the Core course on 'Environmental Studies' as directed by the UGC. Issues related to the text book, field visit and workshop were considered. Resolved that the syllabus recommended by the UGC is to be adopted and the course be conducted by the Department of English in association with Departments of Botany and Zoology.

## Approval regarding the modification of;

#### Syllabus for M.A. English a)

The Governing Council considered the Academic Council proposal to replace the elective paper "Film Studies" with "European Fiction" for the fourth semester MA Programme. Resolved to approve the same.

#### b) Syllabus for B.A. English

The Governing Council considered the Academic Council proposal to remove the last segment "Technical White Paper" from Module 4 of "Technical English" from the second semester of BA (Self-Financing) with immediate effect on the request of Board of Studies. Resolved to approve the same.

## c) Syllabus for B.A. Malayalam

The Governing Council considered the Academic Council proposal for replacing the poems 'Gazal', 'Pengalude Bible', 'Librarian Marichathil Pinne' and 'Thiramazha' in the Module 4 being taught in the First semester of the programme with 'Draccula' and 'Vanamakkal Yesuvinodu samvadikkunnu' Resolved to approve the same.

## d) Amendment of answering pattern for B.A. Malayalam

The Governing Council considered the Academic Council proposal for the amendment of the word limit from 120 words to 2 pages in the Section II of all papers in B.A. Malayalam Programme. Resolved to approve the amendment.

## e) Modification of Syllabus for B Com.

The Governing Council considered the Academic Council proposal for the inclusion of "Research Methodology" and "Basics of Inferential Statistics" for Semester V and VI respectively as part of the project work for B.Com (3 hours per week). Resolved to approve the amendment.

## Approval of Examination reforms

The Governing Council considered the following proposals of The Academic Council

- All examinations CAT and ESE- be brought under the Controller of Examinations
- Two Deputy Controllers will assist the Controller of Examinations(one each for CAT & ESE)
- Two Chief superintends will be in charge of the conduct of examinations(one each for CAT & ESE)
- Two continuous assessment tests (CAT) are to be conducted for each course in a centralized manner with a duration of 1 ½ hours each.
- Even semester examinations for all the programmes are to be conducted simultaneously.
- CAT-I examinations will be conducted in three days with two examinations on each day (9.30 am - 11.00 am and 2.00 - 3.30 pm).

The Governing Council ratified the proposals.

#### a) Question paper setting

The Governing Council considered the proposal for setting at least 10% of the question papers of the end semester examinations by external examiners; however, it was resolved to restrict such a practice to the next two semesters only.

### b) Valuation of Under graduate programme answer papers

The Governing Council resolved to implement a centralized system of valuation of UG answer papers in which the valuation of each paper (course) should be done by the additional examiners in the presence of the Chief Examiner.

## c) Approval of Continuous Assessment Tests for PG Programs

The Governing Council resolved that the Continuous Assessment Tests for PG Programmes are to be conducted by the respective departments and the average marks of the two CATs for each paper is to be awarded as the Continuous Assessment Tests marks.

### d) Question Paper analysis

It was decided to constitute expert panels to analyze the question papers after the examinations so as to ensure objectivity in evaluation. The power to appoint such panels is vested in the Principal.

### e) Back Paper Appearance

It was resolved to introduce the provision for back paper appearance for UG and PG programmes. The idea mooted by Dr S. Kevin that a student shall be allowed 4 chances within two years after the Programme to clear the arrear unanimously accepted by the Council. Resolved to implement the same with effect from 2015-16.

## Annual Graduation Ceremony

The Governing council unanimously decided to conduct annual graduation ceremony and to institute medals for meritorious students.

#### Remarks

His Lordship underscored the necessity of inculcating a work culture conducive to research and academics. All the members of the faculty ought to support the institutional effort in its stride towards excellence.

The Principal explained the effective functioning of the existing Students Grievance Redressal mechanism and Remedial Teaching in the college, in response to questions raised by the Pro Vice Chancellor Dr N. Veeramanikandan.

Rev Fr Joseph John expressed his deep concern over the low pass percentage of History and Malayalam students. Dr C. Stanley John attributed the low pass percentage to their poor proficiency in English.

The meeting started at 03.15 P.M. and concluded at 05.00 p.m.

# MINUTES OF THE GOVERNING COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON APRIL 30, 2016 AT THE IQAC HALL

The meeting of the Governing Council was held in the IQAC Hall, Fatima Mata National College, Kollam, at 11.00 am on 30-04-2016. Rt Rev. Dr Stanley Roman, the Bishop of Quilon graced the occasion. Rev. Fr. Anil Jose, Manager of the College, presided over the meeting. The following members were present:

The Meeting commenced with a silent prayer. In his introductory remarks the College Manager, the chairman of the council, outlined the agenda of the meeting and extended a cordial welcome to the members.

## Minutes of the previous meeting

The Principal handed out the minutes of the previous meeting of the Governing Council held on 28/01/2016 and recapitulated the salient aspects. The council, after a brief discussion, unanimously approved the minutes.

Dr Jitendra Tripathi was all appreciation for the inclusion of Research Methodology in B.Com Syllabus with 3 instructional hours a week. He also underscored the necessity of the college registering with Public Financial Management System (PFMS) for availing of financial assistance from Central Government, UGC, etc. The Council unanimously agreed to his suggestion to abide by the Central Government directive.

Sri Anil Xavier IAS suggested initiating a permanent mechanism for departmental ranking in line with the state government's methodology so as to impart a healthy competition among the teaching departments. However, the Body sought another year or two to implement the same.

#### Action taken report

The Principal reported on the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting as per the agenda circulated. The Governing Council ratified the action taken on the minutes.

#### Budget Proposal - UGC Autonomy Grant 2016-17

The Governing Council ratified the budget proposal of the Finance Committee for Autonomy Grant to be received from the UGC during the Financial Year 2016-17.

Dr Jitendra Tripathi asked the Principal to forward budget proposals to the tune of Rs. 2500000/- w.e.f. 2017. He also suggested that the college submit a viable proposal to the UGC seeking financial support for building a hostel for female students.

#### **Examination Remuneration**

The Governing Council approved the Finance Committee's proposal of Remuneration for Examination related duties with an amendment. As per the amendment, the remuneration to be paid to the examiners within the college for the valuation of all regular/supplementary/improvement of the theory examinations of the postgraduate programmes is fixed at Rs.25/Paper (against the Finance Committees proposal of Rs 23/paper). The Governing Council fixed examination related remunerations as detailed below.

3. The remuneration for the revaluation of answer scripts is fixed at Rs 25 per paper subject to a minimum of Rs 100 per day

4. The remuneration for practical examinations shall be paid as per

University rates/norm

5.The remuneration for setting question papers and scheme of valuation for the examiners of the college for the UG Programme is fixed at Rs 500 (Rs 250 for QP and Rs 250 for scheme of valuation)

6.The remuneration for setting question papers and scheme of valuation for the external examiners for the UG Programme is fixed at Rs 1000 (Rs 500 for QP and Rs 500 for Scheme of valuation)

- 7.The question papers for the PG examination are to be prepared by the external examiners and the remuneration for the same is fixed at Rs 2000 (Rs 1000 for QP and Rs 1000 for scheme of valuation)
- 8.The remuneration towards the exam work of the non teaching staff shall be divided equally by the AA
- 9.The remuneration for PG Valuation is fixed at Rs 28 + DA+ TA II class. An examiner shall evaluate 10 answer scripts on the first day and 15 answer scripts each on subsequent days
- 10. The remuneration for non-teaching staff (excluding the AA) shall be fixed on the basis of student strength
- 11. The AA is entitled to remuneration equivalent to that of an invigilator per session
- 12. The entire sum of remuneration due to the non-teaching staff shall be uniformly disbursed among them by the AA
- 13. The AA is authorized to distribute all the pending remuneration/allowances till 2015-16, due to the non-teaching staff (excluding the retired AA), from the sum to be handed over to the present AA

14. The allowance due to the former AA shall be paid by the Manager

Introduction of Bachelor in Computer Application (BCA) Programme

under Self Financing Stream (2016 Admissions) The Governing council gave its formal ratification to the Academic Council proposal for introducing Bachelor in Computer Application (BCA) Programme under the Self Financing Stream adopting the scheme and Syllabus of the University of Kerala.

Certificate/Diploma Programmes

The Governing council approved the proposal for introducing the following Certificate/Diploma programmes under the Self Financing Stream.

## Feedback Analysis 2015-16

The Governing council unanimously expressed its appreciation for the excellent rating (more than 90%) in the different aspects of curriculum, development, and PTA meetings and extracurricular activities.

The members wanted to strengthen the ICT enabled teaching and learning process. The delay in the result and the poor rating (51%) was beyond the control of the institution as the examination were under the purview of the University. However the college has to prepare itself and insist on the timely conduct of examinations and publication of results of the autonomous period

#### **Graduation Ceremony**

The Governing Council authorized the Principal (in the exercise of the powers as per 2.1.4 (viii) of the Examination Manual) to forward the tabulation mark register and the tabulation result register of MA/MSc/M.Com 2014-16 batch, approved and recommended by the Awards Committee, to the University of Kerala for the Award of Degrees, so as to avoid the delay in getting the Degree Certificates.

The Council also authorized the Principal to issue the Consolidated Mark Sheets to the Students.

The Council asked the Chairman to chart out a plan of action to conduct the Graduation Ceremony on receipt of the Degree Certificates from the University. A concerted effort must be made to bring together as many dignitaries as possible to make the function a grand event.

The Meeting commenced with a silent prayer.

College Manager, the chairman of the council, in his introductory remarks thanked the Principal for the accomplishments so far under the new framework of academic autonomy. He also outlined the agenda of the meeting and extended a cordial welcome to the members.

#### Minutes of the previous meeting

The Principal handed out copies of the minutes of the previous meeting of the Governing Council held on 30/04/2016 and read out the essential points. The council, after a brief discussion, unanimously approved the minutes.

#### Action taken report

The Principal reported on the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting as per the agenda circulated. The Governing Council ratified the action taken on the minutes.

#### Budget Proposal – Autonomous Fund 2016-17

The Governing Council ratified the budget proposal of the Finance Committee for the Autonomous Fund during the Financial Year 2016-17. The Budget projected an expected expenditure of Rs.5158000/- (Rupees Fifty one Lakh Fifty Eight Thousand only) against an expected income of

Rs.5558810/- (Fifty Five Lakh Fifty Eight Thousand Eight Hundred and Ten only).

#### Statement of accounts of Autonomous Fund and UGC Grant 2015-16

The Governing Council approved the Income and expenditure account (Autonomous Fund and UGC Grant) for 2015-16.

#### **UG/PG Results**

The Governing Council made a comprehensive analysis of the results of the first, second, third, and fourth semester of BA/B.Sc./B.Com (2014-'17); and MA/M.Sc./M.Com (2014-'16). Dr S. Kevin, Dr Padma Rao and Rev. Fr Joseph John expressed grave concern over the relatively low pass percentage of BA Malayalam. The Principal attributed it to their poor performance in the English papers which had affected the overall result. He informed the council about a bridge programme, which is on the anvil, to redress the situation.

The Governing Council unanimously ratified and approved the results of the UG and PG Exams and resolved to make recommendations to the University of Kerala to confer the award of Degrees to the Postgraduate students of MA/M.Sc./M.Com 2014-16 Batch.

#### **Provisional Certificate**

The council delegated the Principal to make a representation to the University seeking powers to issue provisional certificates to the college students so as to avoid inordinate delay in getting the provisional certificates from the university.

#### **Pass Certificate**

The council entrusted the Principal with the responsibility of issuing pass certificates to students on demand, after levying a fee. The template of the pass certificates may be designed by the college.

#### **New Programmes**

The Manager put across the need for introducing new UG programmes in Biochemistry and Microbiology to meet the needs of the changing academic requirements, and the council asked the Principal to initiate the formal procedure.

#### Preparation of Text book

The governing council accepted the Academic Council proposal for the introduction of Environmental Studies as Core course at the UG level and the drafting of a reference text book with the contribution of a panel of teachers from within the college.

## Modification of M. Sc. Botany Viva Voce Examination

The Governing Council approved the Academic Council proposal for including Submissions and Viva Voce Examinations in all the first three semesters of the MSc Botany Programme, and drawing up a departmental schedule for it; and conducting a comprehensive Submission-cum-Viva-Voce Examination at the end of the Programme.

#### Continuous Assessment Test (CAT)

The Governing Council approved the Academic Council resolution to conduct an additional Continuous Assessment Test – CAT – III towards the end of the semester, for students admitted late or those who could not appear for CAT – II due to unavoidable reasons.

#### Curriculum design

The Governing Council approved the following proposals of the Academic Council for revamping the present curriculum to meet the requirements of the revised grading system of NAAC for autonomous colleges.

- a) All undergraduate curricula be refurbished with the inclusion of contents with direct applications or impact on the society.
- b) Curriculum modification may be done, taking the suggestions from the stakeholders into consideration
- c) Frame a work plan for every 60 days at the departmental level
- d) Remedial teaching through the involvement of students
- e) More student activities be encouraged with extra credits to students

#### Students' Hostel

The Governing Council felt the need for Students' Hostels in order to attract and accommodate students from faraway places including foreign students. The Manager promised to take up the matter with the Management Board.

### **Community College**

The Governing Council authorised the Principal to go ahead with the modalities of B-Voc Programmes in:

- 1. Travel & Tourism
- 2. Journalism
- 3. Banking, Financial Services and Insurance

### Other Decisions

- 1. To set up a help desk during the time of admissions
- 2. To conduct both Online and Offline admissions
- 3. To keep a constant vigil on fake websites

Unit III: Particle Physics replaced with Nuclear Models. Particle Physics

Unit III: Particle Physics replaced with Nuclear Models. Particle Physics portion shifted to the third Unit of PPH42. Nuclear Reactions introduced in the Unit.

Unit I: Renamed as Nuclear force and two body problem

Unit II: Renamed as Nuclear Fission and Fusion. Introduced: Nuclear Reactor theory, reactor buckling, critical size, reactor materials, reactor control, breeder reactor, thermonuclear fusion, fusion in plasma, fusion reactor, conditions for sustained fusion, magnetic confinement, toroidal confinement: Tokamak.

hypothesis, properties of pi mesons, muons, K-mesons and hyperons, particle interactions and Feynman diagrams, symmetries and conservation laws, CPT invariance, Gellmann Nishijima Formula, Quark Model, Quantum Chromo Dynamics (QCD)

PPH43N (Special Paper II) Radiation Physics

Unit II Renamed as Nuclear instrumentation and dosimetry. Included Nuclear instrumentation with topics: Particle accelerators-electrostatic accelerators-cyclotron accelerators-synchrotrons-linear accelerator, LHC (basic idea only) colliding beam accelerators, Tandem Gas filled detectors, Ionization Chamber, Proportional Counter, Scintillation counter, Cerenkov counter, semiconductor detectors [Si(Li), Ge(Li), HPGe]

Unit III Introduced: Natural exposure pathways - exposure through manmade source - X-ray, Ultra sound, CT, MRI scans (elementary ideas only) and (ii) Two experiments related to Nuclear Physics in PPH61 Advanced Physics Practical using GM counter; and three experiments in PPH 62 related to Advanced Electronics Practical using microprocessor 8085 to be included.

The meeting of the Governing Council was held in the IQAC Hall, Fatima Mata National College, Kollam, at 11.00 am on 28-01-2017. Rev. Fr. Anil Jose, Manager of the College, presided over the meeting. The following members were present:

The Meeting commenced with a silent prayer.

The College Manager, the chairman of the council, in his introductory remarks thanked the Principal for the accomplishments so far under the new framework of academic autonomy. He also outlined the agenda of the meeting and extended a cordial welcome to the members.

#### Minutes of the previous meeting

The Principal handed out the minutes of the previous meeting of the Governing Council held on 28/09/2016 and read out the essential points. The council, after a brief discussion, unanimously approved the minutes.

#### Action taken report

The Principal reported on the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting as per the agenda circulated. The Governing Council ratified the action taken on the minutes.

The meeting discussed comprehensively the following aspects of the Agenda

- > Examination Manual: Amendments
- > Modification of Syllabus & Evaluation
- New Programmes Add on Certificate Qualifications:
   BEC (Business English Certificate)
   TKT (Teaching Knowledge Test)
- Community Colleges

#### **Examination Manual: Amendments**

The Council deliberated on the amendments to the Examination Manual proposed by the Academic Council based on the suggestions by the University of Kerala. The Governing Council unanimously decided:

- 1. To take up the amendments with the legal advisor of the management as to see the legal implications of the provisions.
- 2. To make a representation to the University stating the practical difficulties in getting the service of the external faculty alone for the evaluation of answer scripts. Also decided to approach the honourable high court of Kerala if inevitable.

The Council ratified the amendments appended (vide attachment 1) subject to the opinion of the legal advisor.

#### Modification of Syllabus & Evaluation

The Council entrusted the principal to organize a workshop on curriculum design and syllabus revision. The council felt the need for revamping of the syllabus so as to make the courses equivalent to that offered by the prestigious autonomous institution such as Loyola College Chennai, SRCC Delhi, and St Stephen's College Delhi. To get the PG students equipped for UGC-CSIR NET/JRF Examinations, a comprehensive test (UGC/CSIR model) should be introduced within the Department. A workshop can help a long way in equipping the teachers for better designing the curriculum in sync with the latest developments, recent trends and local needs.

The Council recommended introduction, if possible, of Econometrics and Mathematical Economics for BA Economics. An MoU may be signed with Kerala Veterinary and Animal Sciences University (KVASU) to facilitate introduction of new programmes and interdisciplinary research to the profit of the Departments of Botany, Economics, and Zoology. A Workshop for teachers may be organised under the auspices of Kerala Veterinary and Animal Sciences University (KVASU). A comparative analysis of the results of the college and that of the University for the last Five years will help us identify the shortfall in achievement if any under the autonomy stream so as to evolve a work plan for improvement.

It was high time that the college go for Technology Business Incubation that enables Translating ideas into products - Organic farming, Interdisciplinary research. #### <u>Item No -8 - Approval of the recommendations of IQAC</u>

The Academic council in its meeting held on 17.04.2019, approved the recommendations of IQAC in the following regard:

- a) Introduction of MOOC (online courses) the Academic Council resolved that the students of third semester UG & PG w.e.f 2018 admission onwards take at least one online course of not less than two weeks duration (on an experimental basis) and submit a concise report of the course detailing the objectives, frame work and relevance of the course. The students should produce relevant documents to attest their satisfyingly completing the course.
- b) MOODLE (assignments & tests) Academic Council resolved that UG students submit their assignment and PG students take their CAT I using the MOODLE platform (on an experimental basis). Applicable to all admissions.
- c) Internship for PG programmes Academic Council resolved that internship of the duration of two to five weeks be made compulsory for PG programmes w.e.f 2019 admission onwards. However, there will be no additional weightage for the time being.
- d) The body expressed its appreciation for the good rating in the different aspects of curriculum, skill development, infrastructure facility, examination and PTA meetings and extracurricular activities. However certain areas as per the report need to be strengthened in the attainment of learning outcomes and curricular activities.

The Governing Council ratified the recommendations. The Council emphasized the need for maintaining the log book for recording daily attendance of the students countersigned by Firm/ Company/Organisation where the student is assigned internship.

## Item No -12- Amendments to Examination Manual

Academic Council by virtue of its powers as contemplated in Fatima Mata National College (Autonomous) Kollam - Examination Manual (Draft) - clause 30 - resolved to amend the manual incorporating/revising/changing the below mentioned clauses:

- a) Amendments to Examination Manual based on the regulations of University Grants Commission (Conferment of Autonomous status upon colleges and measures for maintenance of standards in Autonomous Colleges) Regulations 2018, New Delhi 12<sup>th</sup> February 2018:
  - i) Clause 2.1.2- "The term of office of the nominated members of the Governing council shall be a period of two years".

ii) Clause 2.1.3-"The Governing Council shall meet at least three times in an academic year".

Teachers should be encouraged to publish articles to present papers in conferences, to engage in collaboration, consultancy and entrepreneurship. Extension activities should be promoted. A written directive to the extent on behalf of the council should be circulated among teachers any leniency, negligence or apathy on the part of teachers shall be dealt with seriously. Frequent motivational talks and monthly inter departmental competition may be organized. The best department prize, the best teacher award etc should be initiated as a token of appreciation and acknowledgement.
