



### 4. HOME VISITS

Students are divided into eight groups and conducted survey at the participating village Moothakkara, Kollam and near by areas. Palliative patients were identified with the help of Asha workers and Quilon Service Society. 10 families were identified and distributed medicines, food kits and medical kits according to their needs

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#### 5. SUPPLY OF MEDICINES

Base on the survey and the details given by the Asha workers, Palliative care needed persons were identified. Volunteers themselves went to those identified houses and enquired about the types of medicines they were using and purchasedthose medicines for 1-2 months according to the cost and supplied to the identified patients.

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#### 6. DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD KITS

Base on the survey and the details given by the Quilon Service Society and Asha workers, Palliative care needed persons were identified. Volunteers themselves went to those identified houses and enquired about their needs and purchased necessary groceries for one month and supplied to the identified patients. Some of the palliative patients were provided with the medicines by some service oriented societies, such patients were selected for grocery distribution.

Volunteers enquired about the financial status of dialysis patients in the Benziger Hospital, Kollam. It was noticed that several patients were skipping the dialysis procedure due to the financial shortage. We identified two patients who were very needy and provided Dialysis Kit for them.

#### 9. COUNSELING FACILITIES PROVIDED

Counseling was done for the bed ridden and cancer patients by the Psychology student volunteers of FMNC.

#### 10. OTHER INTERVENTIONS

Volunteers were initiated a rotating group which included 10 members each of which every month one of the group will be followed the palliative care activity for a selected family who are very needy. Collection of necessities made by the students themselves from their pocket money.




Fig. Cyclathon for cancer care campaign.



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
