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ESTABLISHMENT OF FMNC ELECTORAL LITERACY CLUB PROPOSAL AND CONCEPT NOTE

INTRODUCTION

India is a democratic republic with a federal structure of governance. The officials at federal, state and local levels are elected by way of a systematic, free and fair election process. The Election Commission of India is the nodal authority, established under the Constitution of India, responsible for conducting elections in India. The voter strength is India accounts to almost a glaring 900 million voters, which is way more than the other democracies around the world. Every year the voter strength increases in India, by a significant number of youth crossing the age limit of 18 years and becoming eligible to vote.

As per the Census 2011, there are 14.2 Core young people in the age group 14-19 in India. Given the registration and voting age of 18, there is a sizeable voter age population at 18-19 years besides an equally large population of the future voters in the age group 14-17 who would become voters every year next. As per the Census Data 2011, there are 9.68 Crore children in the age-group 14-17 years with 6.84 Crore in rural and 2.83 Crore in urban areas. Of these 6.97 Crore were enrolled in schools, with 4.76 Crore in rural and 2.21 Crore in urban. Also Census Data 2011, reveals that there are 30.52 Crore children in the age-group 6-17 years with 22.17 Crore in rural and 8.34 Crore in urban areas, of which 24.01 Crore were enrolled in schools, with 17.14 Crore in rural and 6.86 Crore in urban schools. The young and future voters, demonstrated, constitute a sizeable part of India's democratic polity and its future.

In light of the above figures, the Election Commission of India (ECI) has realized the importance of electoral participation and literacy to these young prospective voters of our country. With this vision in mind, the ECI initiated a national programme in 2010 titled Systematic Voters' Education and Electoral Participation (SVEEP). The programme mainly focused on voter awareness and information and motivation of voters for enhancing electoral participation of the voters in India. In view of the sustained efforts under SVEEP (Phase I and II), the voter turnout increased to 66.44% during General Elections 2014 from 58.19% during 2009 LokSabah Elections with substantial increase in voter turnout in assembly elections as well.

ELECTORAL LITERACY CLUBS

The ECI has decided to carry forward the efforts of both phases of SVEEP by moving into SVEEP Phase III. One of the strategic pillars of SVEEP III is 'Continuous Electoral Literacy and Democracy Education'. This phase is being build up with an aim of mainstreaming of electoral literacy among the young and future voters through the curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular interventions at the school, college and the university level including well designed coverage to the voter populations of that age group not covered under the formal educational system.

In pursuance of this, ECI has decided to establish Electoral Literacy Clubs (ELC) in educational institutions for strengthening the culture of electoral participation among young and future voters. The idea behind establishing such clubs is that they shall be the seat of learning through hands on experience and envisaged to serve as a vibrant hub of Electoral Literacy direct interaction in education and other institutions in the country. As a first step in this process, St. Xavier's College, Ranchi has established an Electoral Literacy Club and is working towards making young and future voters electorally literate.

ELC AT FMN COLLEGE KOLLAM

It is proposed to establish an Electoral Literacy Club, as envisaged under the ECI in education institutions and communities not covered under the formal education system to engage future and new voters through extracurricular interventions. ELCs shall be the seat of learning through hands on experience and shall serve as a vibrant hub of Electoral Literacy for developing and strengthening the culture of electoral participation among young and future voters. The Club will work under the aegis of State Election Commission and at the Institutional level, will be headed by Dr. Vincent B Netto, Principal, FMN College Kollam. It is proposed that the Electoral Literacy Club shall comprise of one or two teachers, preferably from the political science department. One Nodal Officer and three students from various departments as campus ambassadors.

Activity Report of Electoral Club.


The activities of Electoral club for the academic year 2018-2019:
