The Plastic Bottle Collection Drive - 2018

As part of the **World Environment Day Celebrations 2018** in the College, the Department of Zoology with the support of **KSCSTE** Thiruvananthapuram, Students of Environmental Club organized a Plastic Bottle Collection Drive. The initiative a hitherto unheard venture in this part of the world was a grand success with 132kg of discarded plastic disposable bottles picked up by the staff and students of the college along with the support of NSS Volunteers.

The collected bottles were handed over to Mr. Benzil Job of M/s **SIGNET RING** General Trading LLC, Mundakkal for recycling.

From our collection we gladly supplied more than 1000 bottles to the students engaged in Flood Relief Operations to distribute cleaning lotions prepared by them.

The quantity of the plastic bottles collected indicates the dedication of those involved. These discarded bottles would have ended in landfills or clogged the drains or landed in water bodies and continued polluting the atmosphere. With this humble initiative we were able to remove this much plastic and above all we relished every moment of this drive where all the ones involved and onlookers gained valuable insights about environment and plastic pollution and the new sense of civic responsibility.

OZONE LAYER DEPLETION- HARMFUL EFFECTS

Ozone layer, also called **ozonosphere**, region of the upper atmosphere, between roughly 15 and 35 km (9 and 22 miles) above Earth's surface, containing relatively high concentrations of ozone molecules (O₃). Approximately 90 percent of the atmosphere's ozone occurs in the stratosphere, the region extending from 10–18 km (6–11 miles) to approximately 50 km (about 30 miles) above Earth's surface. In the stratosphere the temperature of the atmosphere rises with increasing height, a phenomenon created by the absorption of solar radiation by the ozone layer. The ozone layer effectively blocks almost all solar radiation of wavelengths less than 290 nanometres from reaching Earth's surface, including certain types of ultraviolet (UV) and other forms of radiation that could injure or kill most living things.

World Wetlands Day – 2019

World Wetlands Day 2019 was celebrated in Fatima Mata National College, Kollam under the auspices of PG & Research Department of Zoology with the support of Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE), Thiruvananthapuram. The KSCSTE funded the celebrations and issued the guidelines for the conduct of the day. As part of the World Wetlands Day Celebrations on 5th Feb, 2019 at 10 am PG & Research Department of Zoology conducted an *Inter Department Elocution Competition* on “*Wetlands and Climate change*” which was moderated by Dr. Johnson Pius and Dr. Sreelekshmy. First Prize was won by Ms Nihitha Sajan (I DC Physics of FMN College, Kollam), Second Prize was won by Ms. Aleena A (I DC Physics of FMN College, Kollam).

The afternoon session of the day was lively with the participation of 16 UG students vigorously competing in the *Inter Department Essay Writing Competition* on “*Wetlands and Climate change*” which was conducted by Dr. Johnson Pius and Dr. Vijayasree. Sreelekshmy J S of II DC English won the first prize and Shilpa Raj S of III DC Zoology won the second prize.

As part of the World Wetlands Day Celebrations on 8th Feb 2019 at 10 am, The PG & Research Department of Zoology conducted an *Inter Collegiate Poster Painting Competition* on “*Man and Wetlands – The Vital Link*” which was evaluated by a panel of experts including Dr. Johnson Pius, Dr. Charles George D’Cruz and Dr. Vijayasree. 9 contestants from various nearby colleges actively participated. S. Nivedhitha of I DC Psychology (FMN College, Kollam) won the first prize and Tina Terrance of IDC Zoology (FMN College, Kollam) won the second prize.

The Day was celebrated in FMN College on 08th February 2018 at the Jubilee Hall. The celebrations officially began at 10.30 am at the Jubilee Hall with a Prayer Song by I DC Zoology students. Around 150 students including 10 students from 2 other Arts and Science Colleges of the district were assembled. Seminar Kits were distributed to 150 participants on a first come first served basis. Ceremonial Lighting of Lamp was carried out by the delegates and representatives of the staff and students. Coordinator of the WWD 19, Dr. Sarlin. P J welcomed the participants and introduced the resource person, Dr. Hari. B (Assistant Professor, Sree Narayana College, Kollam). The guests in the Dias were welcomed with flowers and applause. In her speech, Dr. Sarlin briefly explained wetlands, its' importance and necessity to conserve etc. In simple words she gave an idea of the main theme of wetland day to the listeners including the staff and students from Humanities and other departments of science of the college.

The Chairperson of the WWD 19, FMNC, Dr. Vincent B Netto (Principal, Fatima Mata National College, Kollam) delivered the Presidential Address. The Principal congratulated the Department of Zoology for organizing such meaningful activities in the college. He reiterated the College management's commitment in extension activities and highlighted the importance of the commemoration of such days. He spoke about the importance of wetlands and about the recent floods, and how we can protect our nearby wetlands and exhorted the students to do whatever they can to conserve it. The listeners welcomed the words with a loud applause.

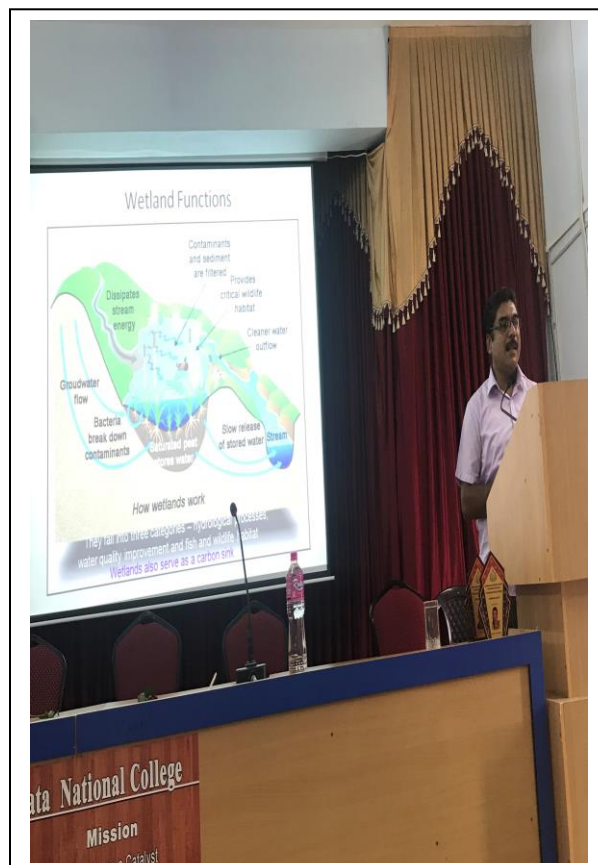
The Day's activities were formally inaugurated by the Resource Person Dr. Hari B, Assistant Professor, S N College, Kollam. Convener of the WWD 19, FMNC, Dr. Antony Akhila Thomas (HOD, PG & Research Department of Zoology) felicitated the gathering and the Principal distributed the Cash Prizes and certificates to the winners. Following the inauguration Dr. Hari B delivered the

Keynote Address. He elaborated on the importance of wetlands and the issues and concerns related to it. The hour long talk guided the students through different types of wetlands, the important role they play as an ecosystem, importance of wetlands and climate change, the indispensable nature of it; the threats they face even when wetlands are inevitable to sustain life. He stressed about the new interest on wetlands to combat climate change. Wetlands can act as very efficient carbon absorbers and is a natural weapon to combat the attack of green house gases.

Following the keynote address, an interesting discussion session about the need to conserve the wetland and ways to do it, ensued. The session was lively with active inputs from the resource person and the faculty. The Staff Association Secretary Dr. Mumtaz Y (Guest Lecturer, Dept. of Zoology, FMNC) felicitated the audience. Ms. Akhila George (I IDC Zoology, Association Secretary) paid vote of thanks and the celebration of the WWD19 at FMNC came to an end. All environment club members actively participated in the wetland day celebrations.

2. Displaying wetlands related articles and news on college campus.

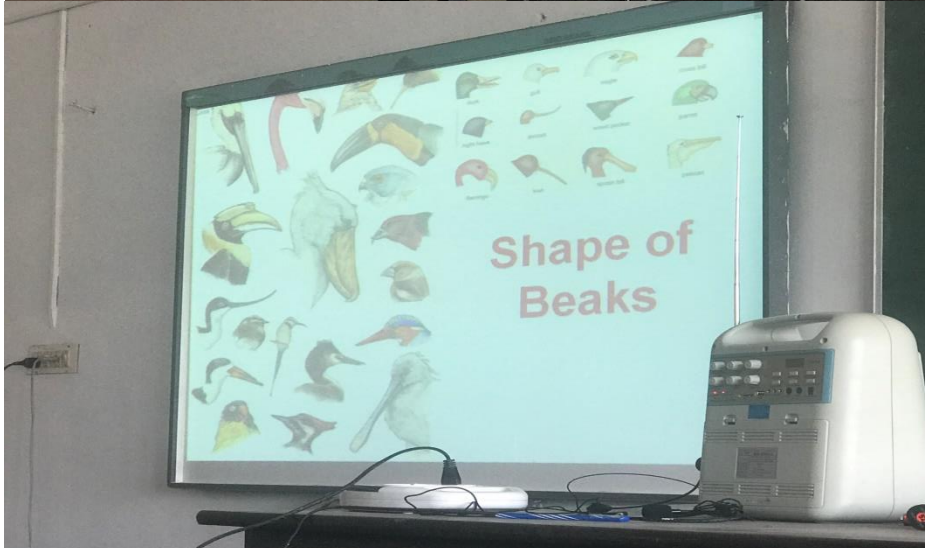






In preparation of the Great Back Yard Bird Count and Campus Bird Count 2019, district level training program was organized at Fatima Mata National College, Kollam on 14th Feb, 2019. Training program started at 1 pm with a silent prayer. Dr Sarlin P J welcomed the guests and participants. Mr. A K Sivakumar, Senior Educational Officer, WWF Kerala, Mr Sajith V (Co-ordinator, WWF and Kerala Biodiversity Board) and Dr. Jishnu (District Medical Officer, Punalur and Co-Ordinator WWF) conducted classes to create awareness about Bird Identification, Bird Counting and also imparted hands on training on e-bird App. Members of Environment Club and Students from PG and Research Department of Zoology, FMNC and a good number of students from nearby colleges (SN College for Men and St St. Stephen's College Pathanamthitta) benefited from the training. Students were guided through the registration and usage of ebird app- an international electronic facility to scientifically record data of birds worldwide. At the end of the session the volunteers were given field training

at the campus and they were able to do the identification, counting and uploading of data on ebird app.

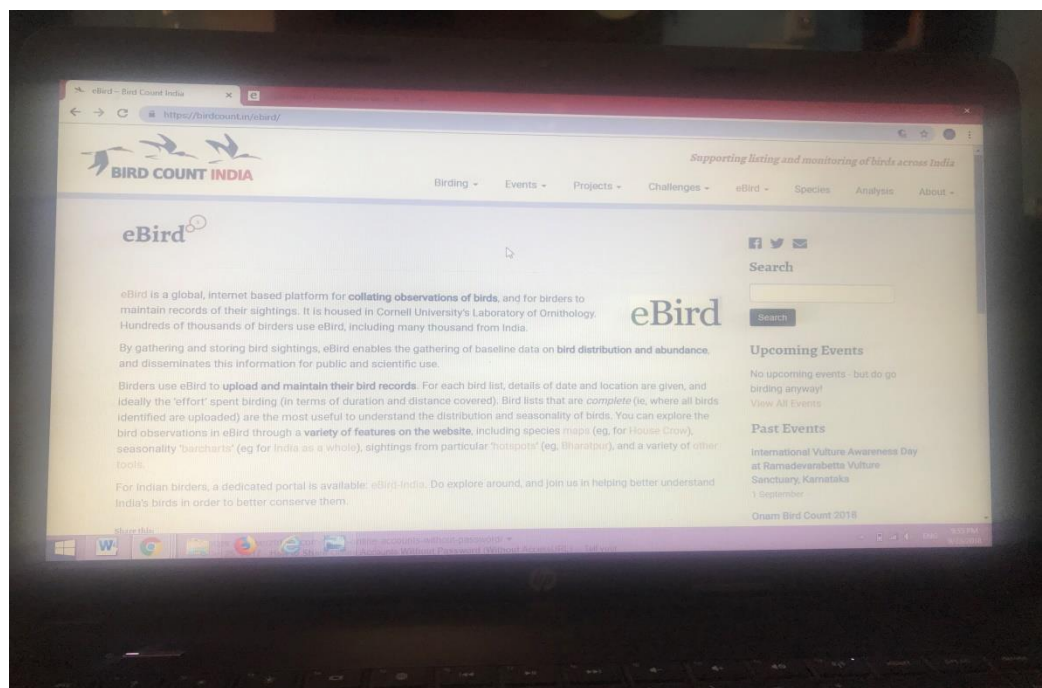

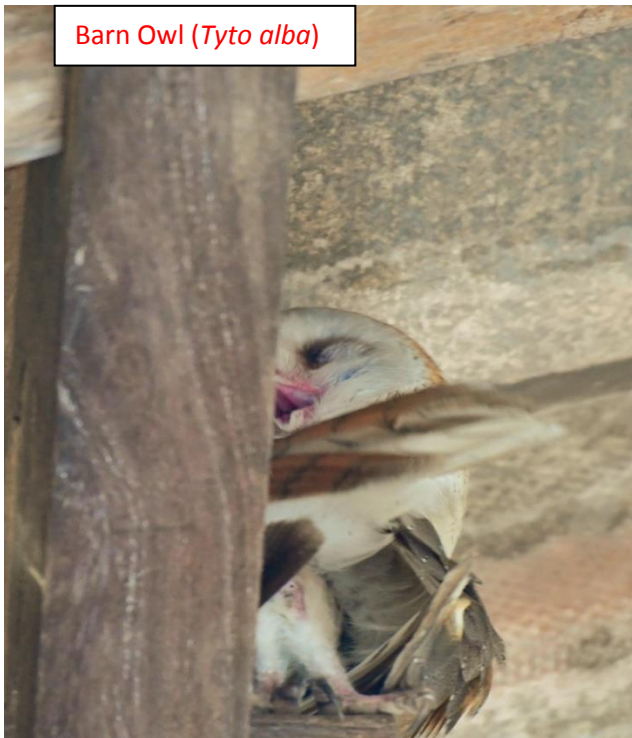

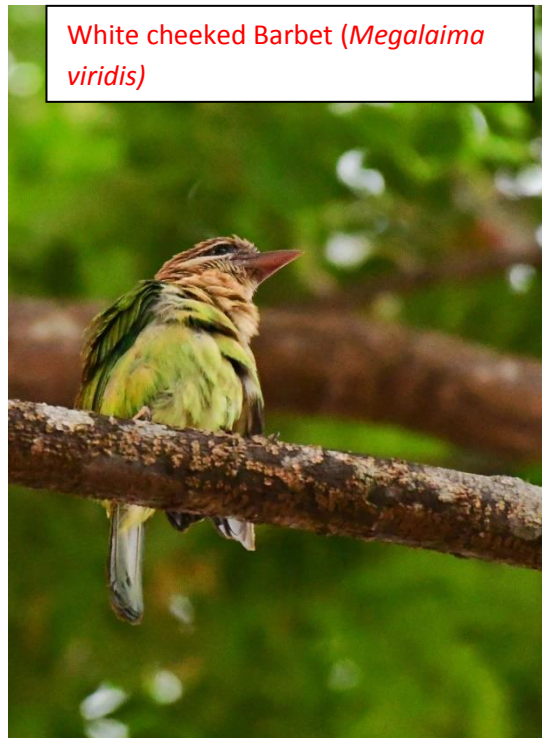

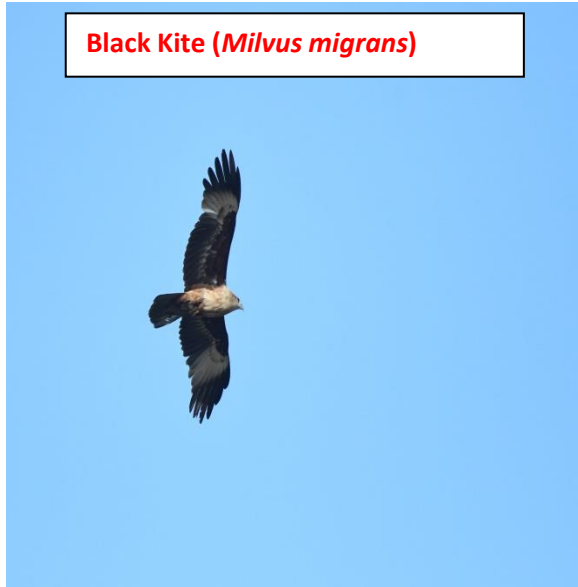
