
World Environment Day was celebrated by NCC (NAVAL)


> One day Seminar on "Harithageham Activities and Modus Operandi"


 Campus cleaning undertaken on 12.08.2016. The campus was cleared of all the solid wastes, which was collected b the Municipal authorities.


• Suchithwa Mission Evaluation Ceremony





IV. 'PLASTIC FREE FATIMA'MISSION

• Plastic Bottle Collection Drive - 2018

As part of the World Environment Day Celebrations 2018 in the College, the Department of Zoology with the support of KSCSTE Thiruvananthapuram, and members of Environmental Club organized a Plastic Bottle Collection Drive, in and around the campus on 05.06.201. The initiative, the first of its kind in the area, was a grand success with 132kg of discarded plastic disposable bottles picked up by the staff and students of the college with the support of NSS Volunteers.





Plastic Pen Collection Drive

Aiming towards sustainable development, AICUF members collected all discarded plastic pens from the campus to send them for recycling. In order to continue the collection process they placed cardboard boxes in all classrooms. The final collection of used pens from all classes was done on 13 - 03- 2019 by the AICUF members. They collected nearly 8kg used plastic pens which was given for recycling.





• Talk on 'Harmful Effects of Plastic Waste'

A talk was delivered by Dr Akhila Thomas, Associate Professor, Dept. Of Zoology, FMN College to the NAVAL NCC cadets.



• Plastic Waste Removal

On August 14, 2017, a mega campus cleaning with special focus on plastic removal was organised in the College. The whole college participated in the activity. All the departments were allotted specific areas for clearing the plastic wastes. Almost all the plastic wastes were collected and removed from the campus. The activity started by 11 am and ended at 3.45 pm. The campus was declared as "Plastic Free Campus" by the Principal.









V. GREENING THE FATIMA CAMPUS

The NSS and NCC (Army and Navy) Units of the College rendered substantial contribution towards 'Greening the Fatima Campus' initiative.

• Vegetable Cultivation Project: NSS

A project submitted by the college NSS unit to Krishi Bhavan, Kollam was sanctioned. Four sites were identified for vegetable cultivation. The NSS volunteers started preparing the ground for cultivation. Seeds were sown in trays and seedlings prepared and replanted later. The ground preparation and plantation process lasted for two months. The volunteers were divided into ten groups and watering works were assigned to each group. Fertilization, application of pesticides and manure, fencing, net supporting etc. were also done.



COLLEGE FARM LAND PREPARATION

The college Farm Land was prepared and cleaned and weeds removed on 22.08.2015. The volunteers started preparing ground for planting plantain saplings. New plants were also planted in the campus. Volunteers were divided into six groups for the preparation of the farm land.

• Neem Green Kerala Project

40 Neem sapling were planted in the college campus by NSS volunteers on 16.06 2017. It was under the supervision of the coordinators of the "Neem Green Kerala Project", Mr. K.P. Kannan(Retired from Children Film Society) and Prof. V. Devaki (Retired Professor, S.N. college, Chempazhanthy).

The College Principal Dr. Vincent B. Netto inaugurated the project by planting the first Neem sapling.

Organic Cultivation Project

As part of the Green Initiative, **Department of Psychology** launched a project called "Manomukulam" on 22-12-2017. The expectation was to promote ways of healthier living, cultivation and having fresh vegetables that are locally grown, devoid of pesticides and other chemical agents. The collective effort resulted in a very flourishing vegetable garden that yielded crops in plenty. The students equipped with the knowledge provided by the technical support team of Kerala Agriculture Department, cultivated crops both in the college and took the practice to their homes as well.













• Tree Plantation Drive (NCC Navy & Army)

In view of social service and community development action plan 2017 of NCC Dte (K&L), the 3(K) Naval Unit NCC participated in the 10 day Tree Plantation Drive under the supervision of the Care Taker Mr Sunil A. The created social awareness about the programme importance of tree plantation. The college conducted GREEN CAMPUS-CLEAN programme on awareness CAMPUS as well as planted trees in college premises and arranged follow up to sustain the project successfully.

During the programme from 5th August to 15th August 2017, a total of 25 saplings of mango tree, jack tree, guava, bread fruit, Indian plum, jambu fruit etc were planted at suitable places of college premises. Cadets showed great enthusiasm in planting them and they

knew their hard work would recharge ground water, prevent soil erosion and preserve nature.



• Grow Bag Cultivation

The NSS volunteers of the college actively participated in the grow bag cultivation activities in the campus on 21.10.2017.

They prepared a mixture of compost and manure and applied to the grown trees in the grow bags. They also prepared seed trays and paved seeds for the next day's activities.

VI. FATIMA GREENREGISTER

Fatima Mata National College has a campus which spreads over 12.92 acres. The sprawling campus abounds in greenery and vegetation. The campus of FMNC is rich in its floral composition and faunal variety. Diverse ofshrubs, herbs, climbers, small trees and large trees are present in the campus. Avian survey also revealed a rich variety of birds in the Campus. Initiatives have been undertaken to document the rich biodiversity of the Campus.



FATIMA DIGITAL GARDEN PROJECT

The plants in the Campus are provided QR Codes, which will be labelled on the plants concerned. The database is maintained at the FATIMA Digital Garden Project page of the college website (http://botany.fmnc.ac.in/garden/). The database is self-explanatory, which includes the botanical details of the plants, photographs, points of interest both for a student of Botany and a layman. The page incorporates URLs to detailed information on the plant (HERE).





ANGIOSPERM FLORA

The campus of FMNC is rich in its floristic composition. Diverse of shrubs, herbs, climbers, small trees and large trees are present in the Angiosperm flora of FMNC Campus. A study of the Angiosperm Flora of the Campus revealed angiosperm plant specimens with 121 field numbers, representing 121 species, including naturalized and indigenous plants belonging to 116 genera of 44 families. There are 59 herbs, 25 shrubs, 10 large trees, 9 small trees and 18 climbers. Among the 44 families, there are about 100 dicots and 21 monocots. The Botanical Garden of the campus occupy major plant species, many kinds of shrubs, herbs and climbers.

Birds Club International

Renowned film personality Mr Jayaraj inaugurated Birds Club International in the college campus on 19.07.2017, by planting trees in the selected location set apart as an undisturbed zone to create the ambience of a natural forest habitat. Department of Zoology and NSS Units actively participated in this reforestation programme by planting trees.







Campus Bird Count, 2019

In preparation of the Great Back Yard Bird Count and Campus Bird Count 2019, district level training programme was organized at the College, on 14th February 2019. Mr. A K Sivakumar, Senior Educational Officer, WWF Kerala, Mr Sajith V (Co-

ordinator, WWF and Kerala Biodiversity Board) and Dr. Jishnu (District Medical Officer, Punalur and Co-Ordinator WWF) conducted classes to create awareness about Bird Identification, Bird Counting, and also imparted hands on training on e-bird App. Members of Environment Club and Students from PG and Research Department of Zoology, FMNC and a good number of students from nearby colleges (SN College for Men and St St. Stephen's College Pathanamthitta) were benefitted from the training. Students were guided through the registration and usage of e-bird app- an international electronic facility to scientifically record data of birds worldwide. At the end of the session the volunteers were given field training.











A study on the avian diversity of Fatima Mata National College campus was done as part of Campus Bird Count conducted by WWF on **February 15, 2019.** The survey was conducted between 8 am and 11.30 am. The birds spotted by participating volunteers students at the above sites formed the basis of the study. Students from Department of Zoology and Environmental

Activities actively participated in the survey. The findings were recorded in e-bird.

BISHOP JEROME BOTANICAL GARDEN

The college has a well maintained Botanical Garden with a rich diversity of flora. It is a treasure house to students, researchers and scientists in the field of plant science. The Bishop Jerome Botanical Garden is an open gallery of live specimens that reflect the microcosm of the tropical plant diversity of the Western Ghats. Department of Botany has been maintaining the Garden since its inauguration in 1954. The Garden was renovated during the period of 2004 - 2006, with financial assistance from the Ministry of Environment and Forest, Government of India. The major attractions of the Garden include a Green house, Mist Chamber and a Pond. About 221 plants are maintained in this Garden which includes Angiosperms, Gymnosperms, Pteridophytes, trees, shrubs, herbs, climbers, ornamental & medicinal plants. The Bishop Jerome Botanical Garden is the primary repository for the research works of Department of Botany. It is mandatory for the PG students of the Botany Department to plant at least two medicinal plants of rare category in the botanic garden and submit a document based on it.











Green House

In keeping with current trends of plant conservation, a well set Green House was established in the Botanical Garden. It is a rich reserve of rare and vulnerable flora. Based on the nature of study, every researcher can make use of the specimens for their area of research. The Green house is a pool of rich genetic diversity. It covers an area of about 450 square feet.



Botanical Museum

Right from the beginning of the Department of Botany, a well equipped museum was maintained. It is a repository of valuable Botanical specimens and Herbaria with more than 500 sheets. A well maintained Xylarium is an added advantage of the Department. The Museum well serves as a source for academic pursuits. researchactivities and It comprises of foremost specimens Algae, Fungi, Bryophytes, Pteridophytes, Gymnosperms, Lichens, and also ecologically and economically important specimens.

BUTTERFLY GARDEN

To create awareness on the interdependence of butterflies and plants, for promoting the zest for butterfly gardening, habitat creation, restoration and conservation, a Butterfly Garden was set up in the college campus on September 2018, supported by PTA. It was inaugurated by Rev. Dr. Paul Antony Mullassery (Bishop of Quilon). Its plant palette includes 27 well adapted plant species including herbs and shrubs. Butterfly Garden covers an area about 1500 square feet.

Every Janma Nakshatra has a symbolic tree or plant that defines man's connection with eternal nature. A Janma Nakshatra Vanam was established in the college campus, next to the Botanical Garden of the college. 27 plants representing the 27 Janma Nakshatra were planted. Plants were labelled with their binomials and the Nakshara concerned.







SHRUB JUNGLE

Shrub Jungle is a plant community characterized by vegetation dominated by shrubs. A Shrub Jungle was established in college campus during 2018-19. The shrubs are grown under ashady tree cover. The jungle includes aesthetically attractive as well as fruityielding shrubs. The Shrub Jungle was inaugurated by Rev. Dr. Paul Antony Mullassery (Bishop of Quilon). The first saplings of the garden were planted by the Principal and the Manager.







FRUIT PARK

On 26th January 2019, NSS volunteers set up a Fruit Park in the Campus. They tilled and cleared the area set apart for the purpose. They planted the saplings and the area was surrounded by protective fencing.






