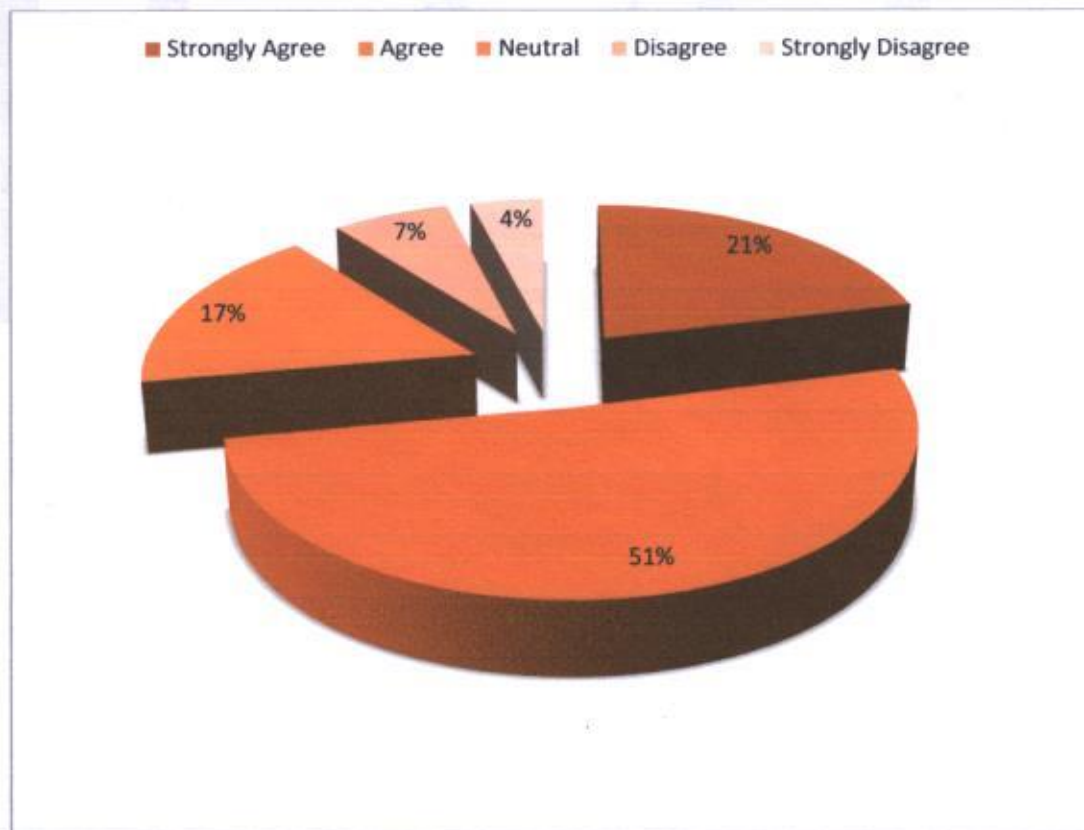

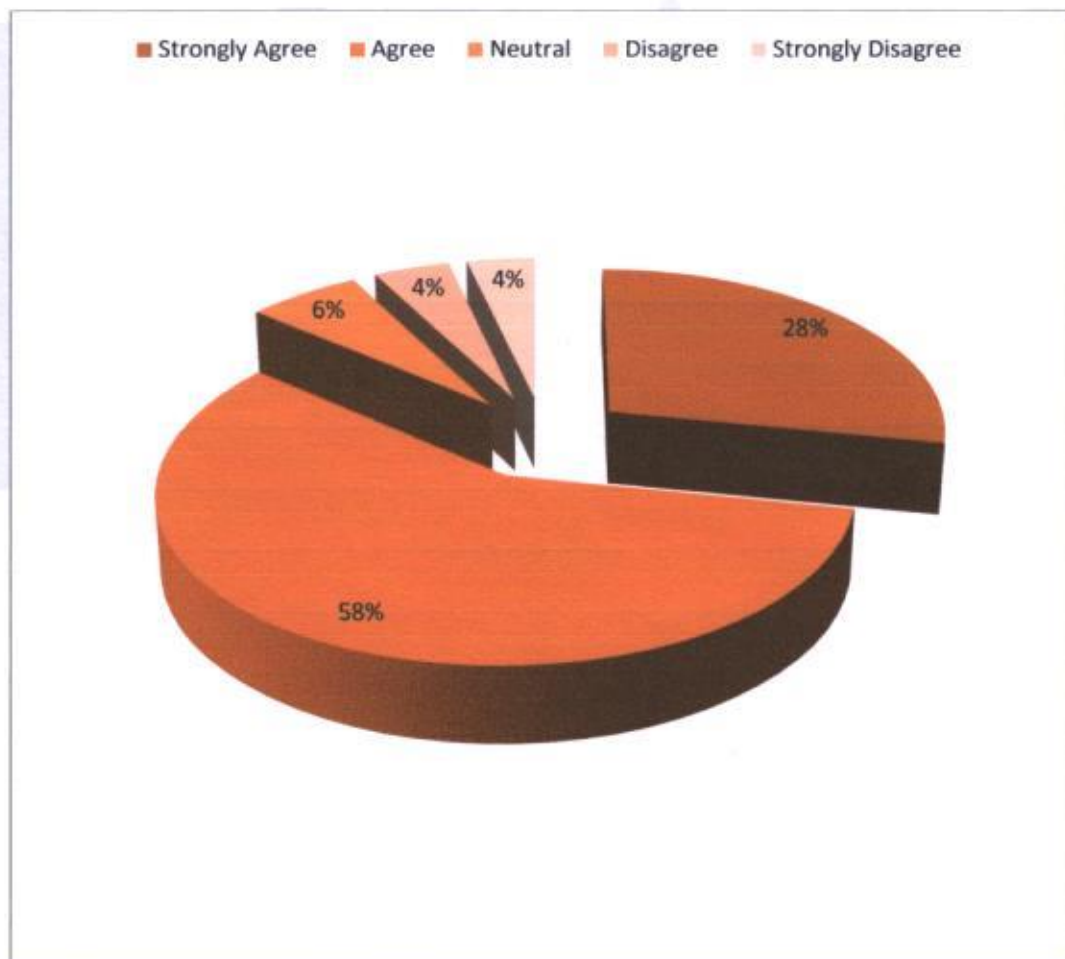
Feedback 1: The programme offered life skills and employability

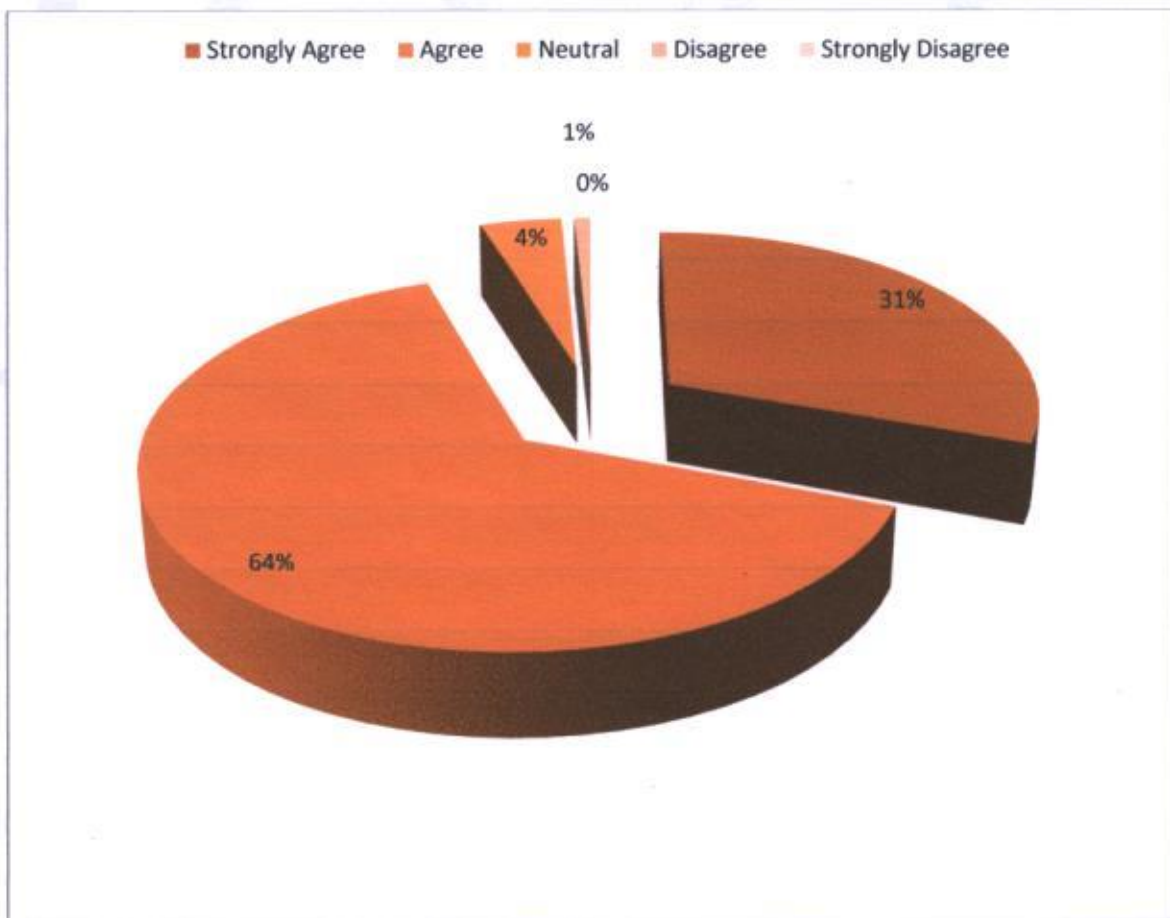
Feedback 2: The programme helped in qualifying competitive examinations

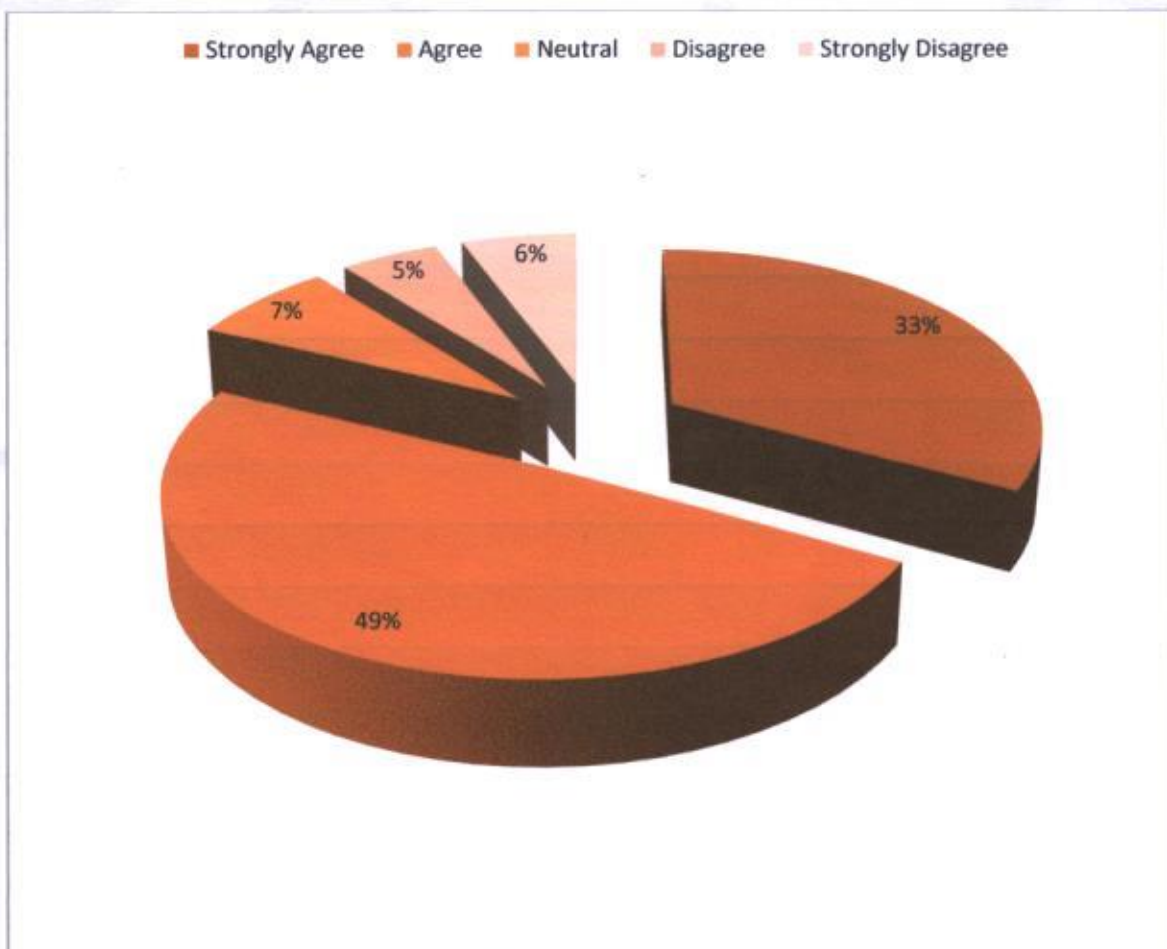
Feedback 3: The programme ensured progression to higher studies

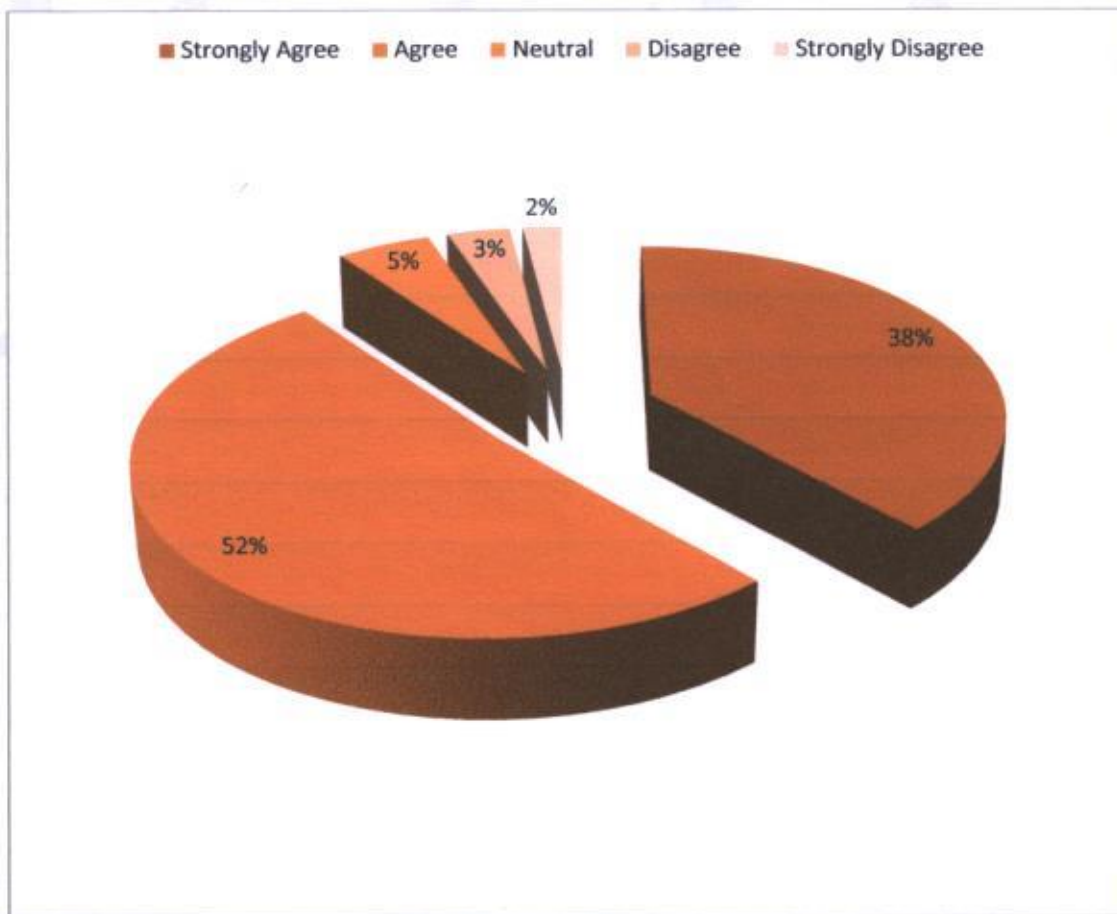
Feedback 4: The programme and courses were updated regularly

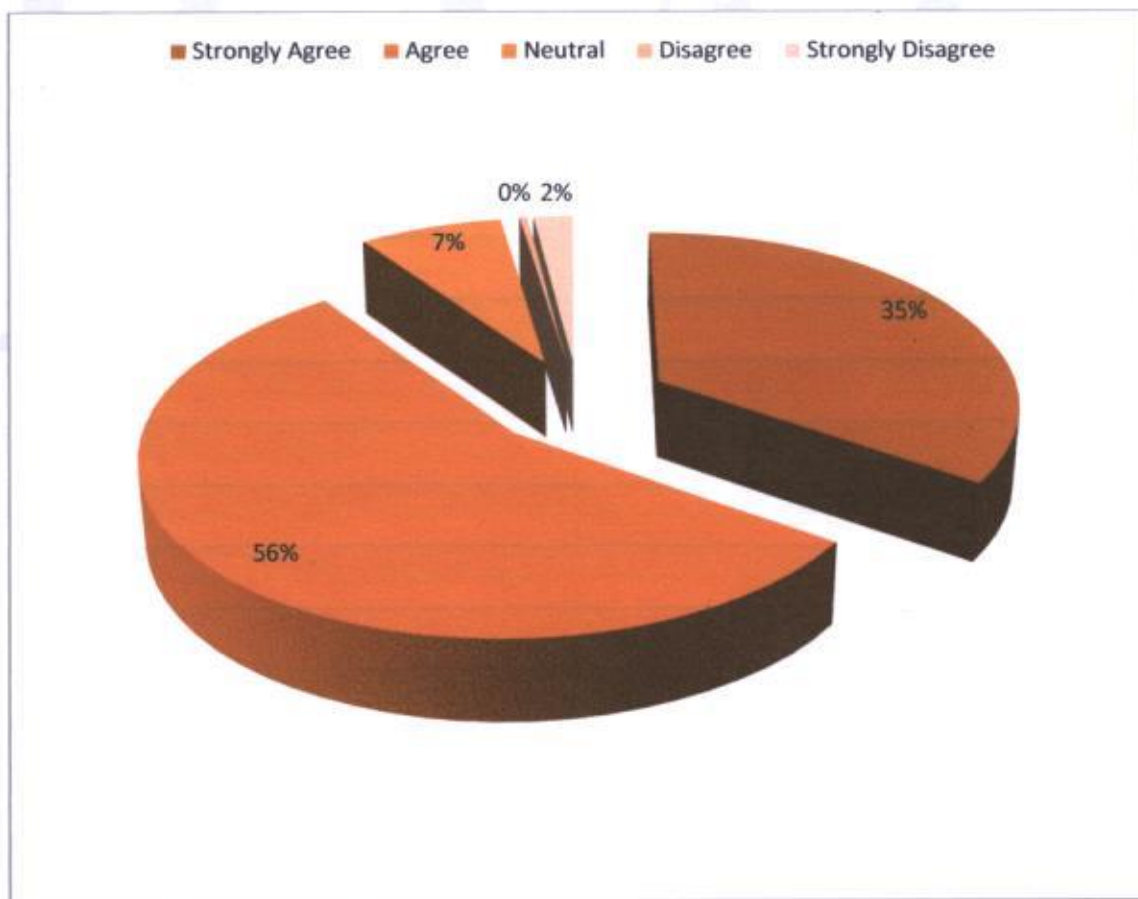
Feedback 5: The Faculty was competent and knowledgeable

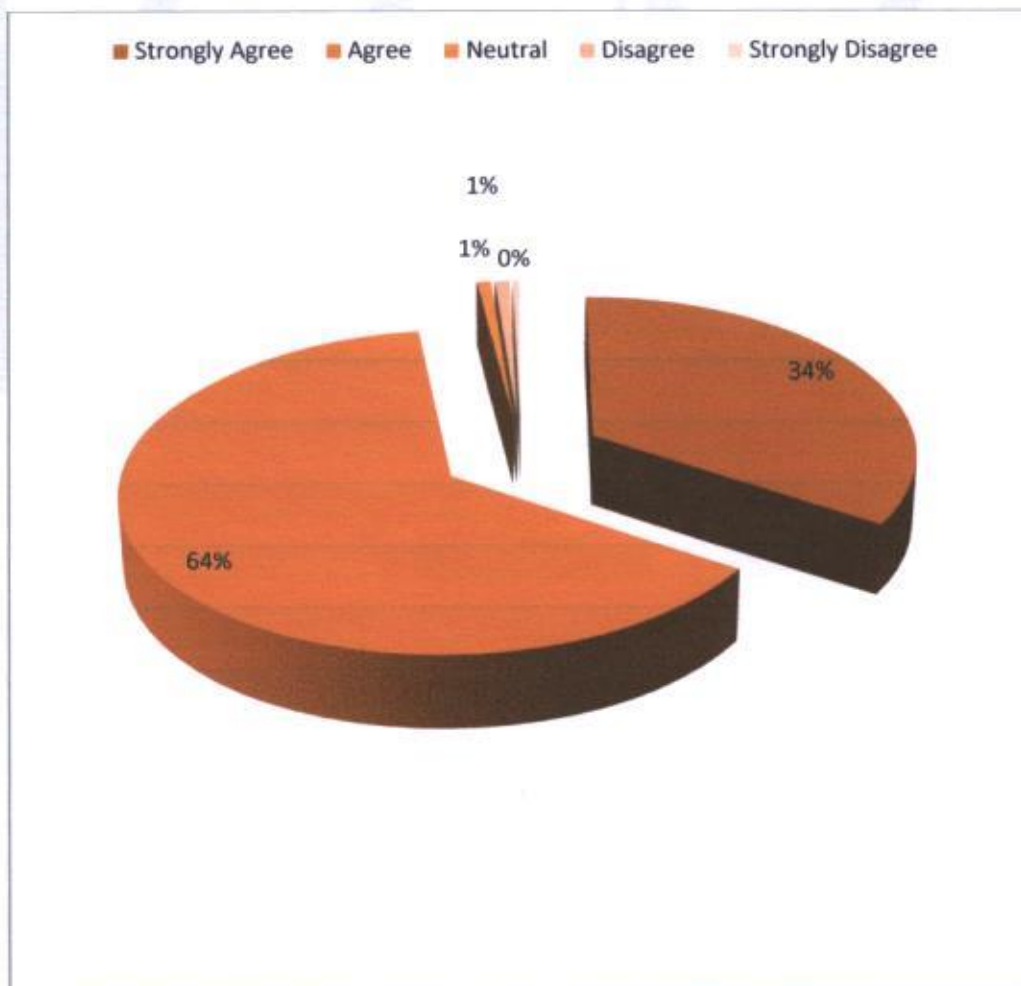
Feedback 6: Special programmes were offered for slow and advanced learners

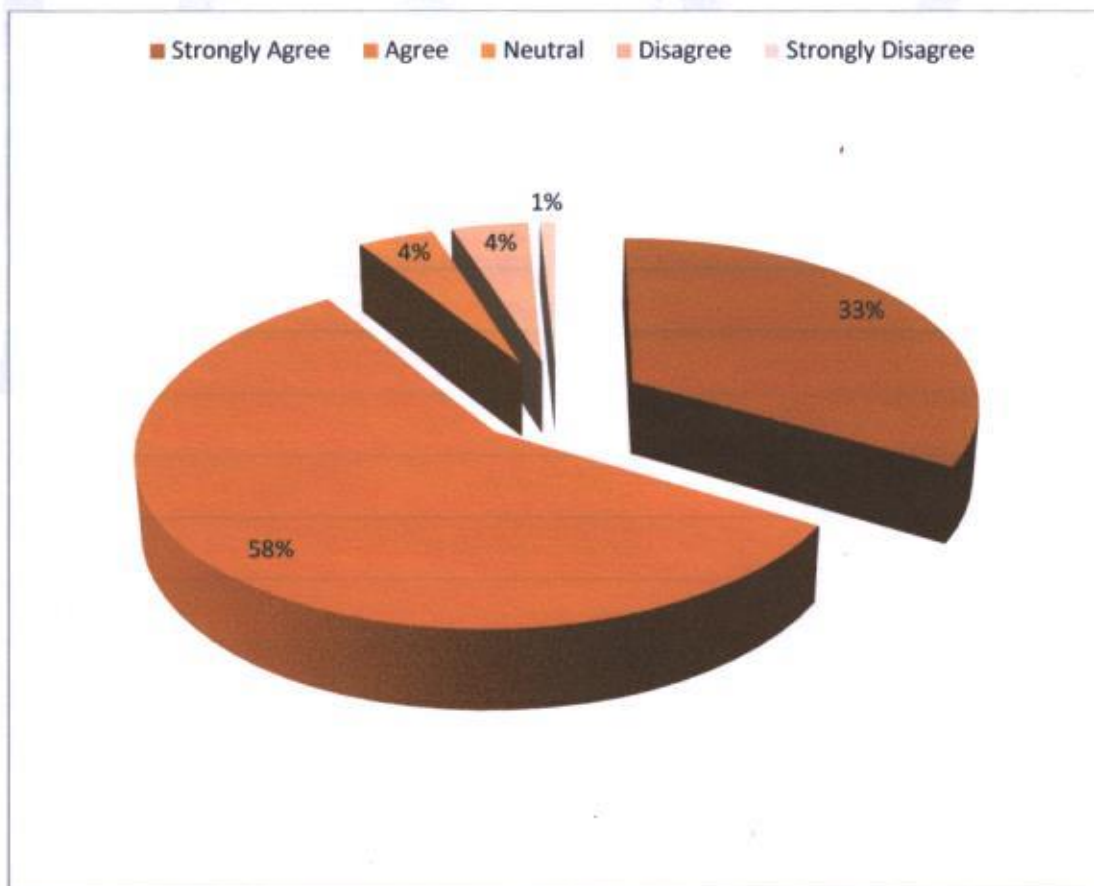
Feedback 7: Examination system was fair

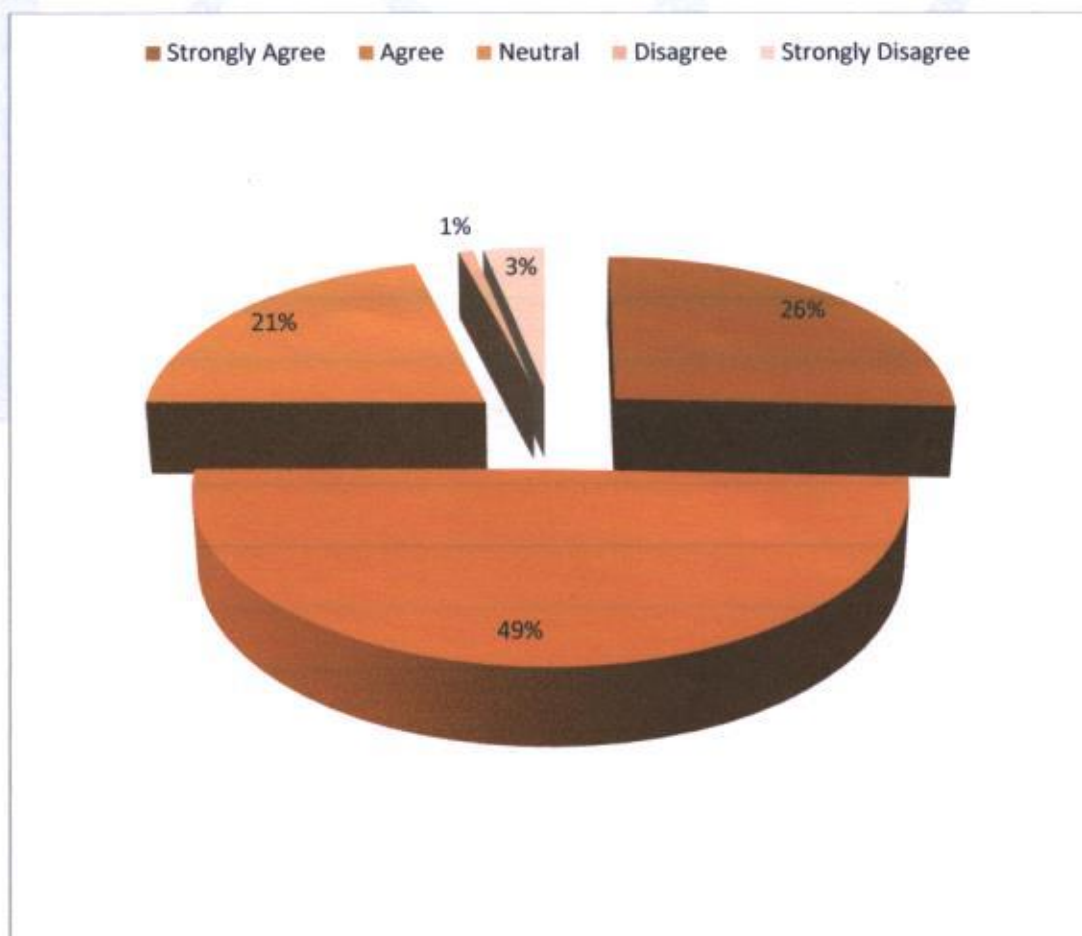
Feedback 8: Maintained strict adherence to the academic calendar

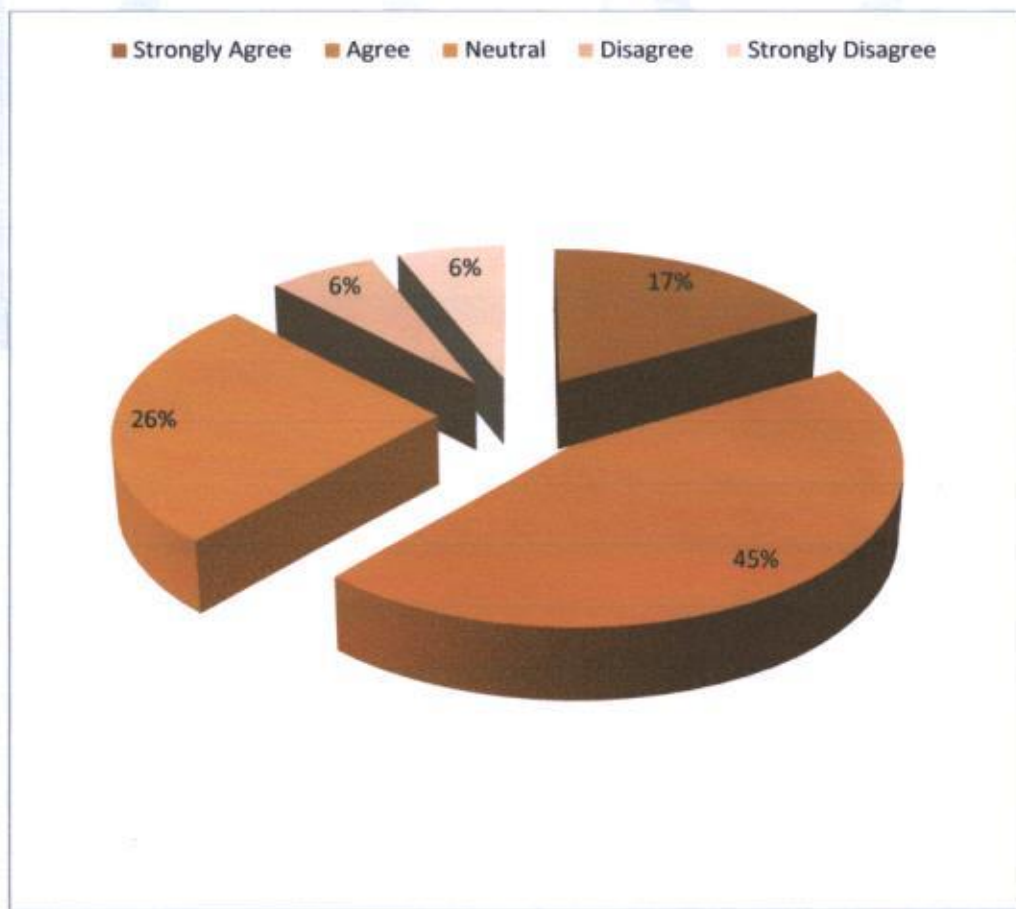
Feedback 9: The infrastructure facilities for teaching and research are excellent

Feedback Analysis

The feedback from the alumni was collected by eliciting their responses on 10 statements related to

1. Prospects of the Programme
2. Regular updation of the courses and contents
3. Quality of Faculty
4. Examination and Evaluation System
5. Adherence to the Academic Calendar
6. Infrastructure
7. Provisions for Extra-curricular activities

The first three statements are pertinent to the Prospects of the Programme. A remarkable majority (71 %) believes that the programmes in FMNC offer life skills and employability. 86 per cent of the alumni who participated in the feedback process believes that the programmes in the College equipped them in qualifying different competitive examinations. 95 per cent are of the opinion that they are enjoying the provision for higher studies, after graduating from the institution. So in total, as per the feedback, the programmes in FMNC are productive with regard to employability and higher education.

THE majority (82%) of the participants in the feedback survey are of the opinion that the syllabus followed in FMN College is updated regularly.

89 per cent of the participants believe in the competence and knowledge level of the teaching faculty, and 90 per cent are of the opinion that special care is provided for both the advanced and slow learners.

A huge majority at 98 per cent stated that the examination and evaluation system at FMNC is transparent and fair.

Regarding the scheduling and implementation of examinations and other academic activities, 91 per cent of the alumni who participated in the feedback survey are sure that the College strictly adheres to the academic calendar.

The infrastructure facilities are satisfactory to 75 per cent of the alumni, but 20 per cent of them take a neutral stand.

Regarding the provision for extra-curricular activities, 62 per cent believe it is acceptable. But the neutral stand at 26 per cent and negative stand at 12 per cent are to be addressed.
