

Fatima Mata National College was established in the year 1951 by His Excellency Rt. Rev. Dr. Jerome M Fernandez with view to providing facilities for the higher education is in the Diocese of Quilon. This year the college is celebrating its 66th year of committed service in the field of higher education. The College was granted autonomous status in the year 2014 by UGC, Government of India. Since then the office of the Controller of Examinations are conducting examinations to all programmes of UG and PG by collecting question papers from external examiners. To make the process of examination hassle free, the institution decided to implement the question bank software for conducting examinations wef 2019 admissions, subject to the ratifications of the Academic Council and the Governing Council.

A one day workshop on Question bank preparation was organized by Fatima Mata National (Autonomous) College, Kollam on 21st March 2018 in association with IPSR solutions Pvt Ltd. The meeting started at 9.30 a.m. with a very short inaugural function. Dr Manohar D. Mullassery (Assistant Controller of Examinations, Fatima Mata National College, Kollam) welcomed the gathering. Dr Vincent B. 

The purpose of the seminar was to initiate a standardized format for self **assessment**. The resource person asserted that at the primary level, the various departments have to submit a self-study report describing the current state of their efforts to improve student learning and the academic quality of their programs, their strengths and weaknesses in the focal areas as specified by the institution, documentation supporting exemplary practices, initiatives to address practices that need improvement, describing implementation plans for improvement initiative. In line with that, at the institutional level IQAC should set up guidelines, in tune with the mission and vision of the institution, directives of the UGC and higher education council. The seminar unanimously concluded that there must be a baseline to measure growth and improvement, planning for the future, establishing goals and strategies to achieve objectives and to monitor change. The gathering viewed that all the stakeholders are to actively participate in evaluation, then it would become feasible to make decisions and take actions based on their evaluation data. The expert also expressed the view that the evaluation approach should aim to increase the probability of achieving program success in terms of Course outcome, Programme Specific outcome and Programme outcome. In the concluding session, the advisor also urged the participants to have dire attention in charting out methodologies and indicators to conduct Academic, Administrative, Examination, Library and Green audits.










The ocean has long been an economic force to reckon with. The term blue economy evolved to define a sestainable approach to the use of natural resources. Professionals connected with the oceans, including the negotiators of the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), defines blue economy as "marine-based economic development that leads to improved human wellbeing and social equity, while significantly reducing environmental risks and ecological scarcities". The developing world has been the driving force behind the blue economy, pioneered by small island developing states (SIDS), but the blue economy is also relevant to other coastal states and to countries with an interest in waters beyond their national jurisdiction. Thus, the blue economy goes beyond just the concept of ocean-based economies; it also identifies the occurs as development spaces where spatial planning integrates conservation, sustainable use, oil and mineral extraction, bio-prospecting, sustainable energy production and marine transport, Goal 14 of the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) "Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, sens and marine resources for sustainable development" - makes detailed references to the reduction of marine pollution, conservation of coastal and marine areas and regulated fish harvest. Disciplinary and interdisciplinary paper presentations on the relevant technological, economic, social and governance dimensions will go a long way in adopting underlying technology and behavioural change towards a Blue Economy, especially in urban and rural water systems concept. The dissemination and interactions at the seminar hopes to project the oceans as an alternate economic model for sustainable development.


