






WORKSHOP ON "BENCHMARKS IN REVISED ACCREDITATION PROCESS"

Seminar on "Relevance of Self-Audit in Autonomy" - 6th February 2018

Resource Person: Shri Anil Xavier IAS (Vice Chancellor, Kerala Veterinary and Animal Sciences University)

The purpose of the seminar was to initiate a standardized format for self assessment. The resource person asserted that at the primary level, the various departments have to submit a self-study report describing the current state of their efforts to improve student learning and the academic quality of their programs, their strengths and weaknesses in the focal areas as specified by the institution, documentation supporting exemplary practices, initiatives to address practices that need improvement, describing implementation plans for improvement initiative. In line with that, at the institutional level IQAC should set up guidelines, in tune with the mission and vision of the institution, directives of the UGC and higher education council. The seminar unanimously concluded that there must be a baseline to measure growth and improvement, planning for the future, establishing goals and strategies to achieve objectives and to monitor change. The gathering viewed that all the stakeholders are to actively participate in evaluation, then it would become feasible to make decisions and take actions based on their evaluation data. The expert also expressed the view that the evaluation approach should aim to increase the probability of achieving program success in terms of Course outcome, Programme Specific outcome and Programme outcome. In the concluding session, the advisor also urged the participants to have dire attention in charting out methodologies and indicators to conduct Academic, Administrative, Examination, Library and Green audits.
